OUR FOCUS AREAS

Good Character & Citizenship

Youth who regularly serve their community are more likely to achieve greater academic, emotional, behavioral and economic outcomes throughout their lives. 70% of Club teen members volunteer in their community at least once per year, while 40% volunteer in their community at least once per month.



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Academic Success

BGCE works to ensure that youth gain the skills, knowledge, and experiences to be ready for school, work, and life, including in the area of STEM. While 25% of youth in Elgin fail to graduate school on-time, among our teen Club members, 90% expect to graduate high school on time, and 76% expect to complete some kind of post-secondary education.

Healthy Lifestyles

Many U.S. youth don't get the recommended hour of daily exercise. Regularly attending Club members report higher levels of daily physical activity than their peers nationally. In Illinois, 30% of young people ages 10-17 are overweight. Programs like Triple Play, SMART Moves, Passport to Manhood, and SMART Girls help youth make healthy choices and receive daily exercise.


